# Concert for Orchestra

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## Instructions

The piece can be performed by String- Wind-, mixed Orchestra or (and) Choire. Percussion instruments (likewise any other sound sources) may be used, as far as fulfilling specific **requirements** concerning sound production (continuous sound; *quartertotes*; *slides*; *splitting*; at least 2½ octaves pitch range).

Bigger ensembles (more than 20 players) may be divided in **groups** (either separate String-, Wind / Percussion sections, or mixed groups), conducted separately (optionally each by an individual conductor).

Instruments proceed in sequences of alternately a single note (any pitch), and a pause, currently in durations **1,2** or **3** units (**1 ~ 60**), non *unisono*.



Pitches **change** with each single attac (any interval permitted).

**Conductor** permanently takes influence on the sound surface, by giving *commands*, in free sequence (regarding *timbre*, tempo, volume or mode of progression).

For communication between conductor and the orchestra, *commands* must be transformed into **handsigns** (by no means use cardboard markers!).

A *command* is currently valid unless *countercommand* is not given. *Commands*, given subsequently, should be executed in **addition** (e.g.: high pitch + pulse + loop + accelerate...), unless they do not stand in contradiction.

As commands currently refer to the subsequent attac, they appear to be executed with a little **delay**.

As the conductor gives a signal for **start**, instruments enter *unisono*.

The piece may be performed in one, or in several **movements**, of indeterminate duration.

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**Commands**

 - high       - middle       - low (change register)

 - **constrict**: (proceed only in *full-* or *halftones*)

 - softer       - louder



 - **stop** (break)       - **reversal** (all commands neutralized)


 - **white noise** (toneless)       - **grey noise** (crunching)


 - **splitting** (*multiphonic*)       - **tremolo** (tremble / flutter)

 - **loop**: (repeat *sequence* literally)

 - **raise**       - **lower** by a **quarternote** (referring to previous note)

 - **up**       - **down** (*slide*, over a short distance)

 - **pulse**: (tone repetition, 2-3 attacks per *quarter*)

 - **thrill** (*half-tone* alteration, quite fastly)

 - **ascend**       - **decend**

proceed up-/downwards, in small intervals\* (subsequently to **high/low**).

**singing** - vocals: a, u, i, o / toneless: ha

**accel.** - accelerate      **rit.** - retard      **sff** / **spp** (sudden change of dynamics)
